NABR's achievements on behalf of the scientific community have ensured that researchers can continue conducting necessary animal research that benefits human and animal health.

- NABR was a leader in the initiative to pass the Animal Enterprise Protection Act of 1992, making it a federal offense to break into research facilities to destroy research.
- NABR led a broad-based coalition of biomedical and academic organization that resulted in the Animal Enterprise Terrorism Act (AETA) being officially signed into law on November 27, 2006 by President Bush.
- NABR has played a key role in numerous amendments to the Animal Welfare Act which carefully balance the conduct of humane and responsible animal research without compromising the advance of scientific discovery.

The scientific community drives NABR's success, and we are committed to providing our members with the knowledge and tools needed to effectively influence state and local policy, as well as to provide a voice on national issues through our response to proposed regulations and outreach to Capitol Hill.
